
PDF book PDFQ: Importing Grails project to Eclipse I've created a Grails application on a Linux system with Eclipse. The project is local, inside the workspace directory, so everything is fine. I can run the server from inside Eclipse and it works. Now, I wanted to import the project in Eclipse, but I'm stuck at the point of "manually extract the archive". I tried to do it by right-clicking on the project name on the directory and selecting "Export" but I don't get the "zip" format (as I expect). What can I do to import my project? A: Eclipse has a built-in "Import" feature. When you right-click on the project, and select Import, there is an option to import a project from the disk, which opens the dialog that lets you select from existing project or import a project from the file system. Select the latter and select "Existing project in workspace". That should take care of it.
